

Camp Agape Cabin Leader Position Description

The Camp Agape Cabin Leaders are seasonal employees of Agape Ministry with the primary responsibility of assisting his/her Senior Cabin Leader in supervising campers, as well as providing program activities for campers and looking after their welfare and safety. The Cabin Leader participates with other staff in meeting the needs of those we serve and in Agape's mission of *encouraging and nurturing ALL God's people to reach their full potential*. Cabin Leaders will be accountable to their Senior Cabin Leader, and the Program and Executive Directors.

Qualifications:

1. Be a practicing Christian.
2. Have current child abuse and criminal clearances, including FBI fingerprinting.
3. Hold current CPR and First Aid certifications or attain them once employed.
4. Be at least 18 years old or graduated from high school.
5. Have experience working with children.
6. Have good communication and organizational skills.
7. Be able to follow tasks through to completion.
8. Be able to enforce camp rules.
9. Be willing to take such training as requested by the Program Director.
10. Be able to swim if supervising campers at the pond.

Essential Functions:

1. Be able to assist campers in an emergency (fire, injury, etc.)
2. Must possess the strength and endurance necessary to maintain constant supervision of campers.

Responsibilities:

1. Participate in complying with Camp Agape policies and ACA standards.
2. Meet and greet campers and families upon their arrival and departure.
3. Be responsible for the well-being and safety of his/her group.
4. Participate in leading and supervising his/her group of campers as assigned during their stay at camp.
5. Assist campers with settling in and checking out.
6. Model appropriate behavior for the campers and staff, including:
 - a. Concern for the environment
 - b. Following Camp rules
 - c. Health and safety concerns
 - d. Caring for each other's needs
 - e. Cleanliness of camp facilities and themselves
 - f. Maintaining appropriate boundaries
 - g. Accepting as a child of God **every camper, staff member, and visitor** regardless of your personal beliefs.
7. Provide leadership for recreation and cabin devotions as assigned.
8. Assist with his/her groups' mealtime chores.

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9. Assist the campers in maintaining the cleanliness and neatness of the cabins and shower house.
10. Attend staff training events and staff meetings.
11. Refer any children in crisis, as well as any discipline problems, to the Senior Cabin Leader.
12. Refer any health or sanitation concerns to the Senior Cabin Leader.
13. As Support Staff (cabin leaders not supervising campers overnight) Junior Cabin Leaders carry out various tasks as requested.

Salary: \$360-375/week (plus room and board); 9-10 weeks including 2 weeks paid staff training.

Dates: June 3rd – August 4th .
